

The Dynamic Care Plan brings together multiple electronic patient records, personal health records, or electronic palliative care coordination systems in standardised data fields and is accessible to all urgent care services. It is based on the openEHR standard that enables information and data sharing.

It enables integration with Acute and Community service Electronic Patient Records (EPRs) and Personal Health Records, as well as interoperability with existing systems and workflows in order for health and care professionals to be able to deliver efficient, timely, patient-centred care. Care plans are shared intially between NHS 111, Out-of-Hours, acute healthcare providers, care homes and primary care.

The plan offers a single template for data entry with the ability to customise the format of the care plan, and the flexibility to design and edit care planning templates, including the underlying data fields.

Challenges

- Data is inappropriately modelled and captured, classified incorrectly, coded improperly and not fit or safe for use.
- Multiple forms care providers not knowing which version is the latest.
- Many forms still kept in a paper format.
- Information is not shared, it is not accurate, it is incomplete, inaccessible and not representative of patient's wishes.
- Patients are having to repeat their story to different health and care providers.

Solutions

- Opnamic Care Plan built on top of the Digital Health Platform which is a key component of the composable architecture approach.
- Better Dynamic Care Plan that provides a generic care planning capability to London's health and care system and integrates with existing IT architectures.
- Platform governance and a 'data-first' approach that enables data (and inputs) to be designed so that it has the appropriate data governance for the desired usage.

- By sharing expertise, data models and clinical content we can avoid re-inventing the wheel, and pace of progress increases.
